

List of Birding Hotspots on Wayne Campus

- 1. Fountain Court Trees, edges of plantings
 - Habitat- Many different trees and flowering and fruiting trees and plants.
 - Birds– American Robin, Nashville Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, Eastern Towhee, Fox Sparrow, Ovenbird.
- 2. Reuther Mall Max Jacobs House/Community Arts, alley behind Max Jacobs House.
 - Habitat- Sweetgum, locusts, crab apple, red pines, ornamental spruces, yew and boxwood hedges, brushy habitat with an open lawn.
 - Birds– Goldfinches, House Finches, White-Throated, Song or other sparrow sp., Robins, and resident Cooper's Hawks.
 - Rare Birds- Wood, Gray-cheeked and Hermit Thrushes, Eastern Phoebe, Lincoln's Sparrow, Downy Woodpecker, Northern Flicker.
- 3. <u>Gilmour Mall</u> Law Library/Pines, Fruit Trees & Shrubs
 - Habitat- Red pines and shrubs; fruit trees near the entrance of the library.
 - Birds— Ovenbird, Gray Catbird, Red and White-breasted Nuthatches, Northern Flicker, various warblers.

4. McGregor Pools/Art Building - Trees

• Birds- Baltimore Oriole, Scarlet Tanager, Hermit Thrush, Wilson's Warbler, Downy Woodpecker, House and Winter Wrens and Eastern Phoebes.

5. Faculty Administration Building - Fruit Trees & Pines

- Habitat- Numerous crab apple trees.
- Regularly Seen Birds- American Robin, Sparrow species, Northern Cardinals and Finch species here.
- Migrant Birds– Golden and Ruby-crowned Kinglets, American Redstarts and other warblers.
- 6. Williams Mall Chatsworth/Student Center Bio-Swale/Warrior Community Garden
 - Habitat- Pines, junipers, and native grasses and flowering plants.
 - Birds- Robins, Juncos, White-throated and Song Sparrows, Northern Cardinals, House Finches, Goldfinches, Downy Woodpeckers.
 - Migrant Birds—Fox Sparrow, Northern Flicker, Hermit Thrush, House Wren.
- 7. Linsell House Bioswale/Rain Garden, foundation plantings
 - Habitat- Sycamore, crab apple, other fruiting trees and conifers in the vicinity.
 - Birds- House Finches, Northern Cardinals, Robins, various sparrows, warblers.
- 8. Old Main Falcons & Fruit Trees
 - Peregrine Falcon nest site on Cass side of clock tower; adults in residence year-round but more active at the site February through June.
